#### **COVID-19 Vaccination Resources**

Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) has been committed to a datadriven and equitable approach to vaccination inclusive of hard-to-reach communities. While all Illinois residents, regardless of citizenship status, should have the opportunity to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, barriers to access may pose a greater problem for some populations than others. This resource list is intended to provide local health departments, community-based organizations, and other community partners with evidence-based information, guidelines, toolkits, training materials, and more to inform their planning efforts.
