
When Must a Provider Give a Good Faith Estimate for a Scheduled Service?





When Do Good Faith Estimates Apply to Emergency Services, including Post-stabilization Services?

Good faith estimates <u>are not required for emergency services up</u> to the point of stabilization (as defined by EMTALA). However, they <u>may be</u> required for care provided post-stabilization as part of the notice and consent process, if the provider is eligible to seek the patient's consent to balance bill.
